Preschool Fee Structure

Preschool Program: 9am-3pm (6 hours per preschool day)

40 weeks per year

(100 days per session per annum)



Minimum preschool attendance is 2 days per fortnight, although most parents select Session A or Session B (5 days a fortnight). However, parents may elect any additional days to suit their own circumstances (subject to availability), and children may attend up to 10 days per fortnight.

Please see the current fees listed below. Note that Centrelink child care subsidies are based on an hourly rate. Covenant reimbursement hours are 6 hours per day (30 hours per Session over a fortnight). More information on Benefits & Rebates is provided further on in the Prospectus.

Centrelink Fee Assistance for Approved Care

Covenant's Early Learning Centre is an approved child care provider for the purposes of Child Care Subsidy.



Child Care Subsidy (CCS)

The Child Care Subsidy helps with costs for approved and registered care such as long, family or occasional day care, outside school hour care, vacation care, pre-school and kindergarten.

On 2 July 2018 the Child Care Subsidy replaced the Child Care Benefit and Child Care Rebate. The Child Care Subsidy is paid directly to services to be passed onto families.

There are also changes to the annual cap which will make child care more affordable for most families.

Eligibility basics

- care for a child 13 or younger and not attending secondary school, unless an exemption applies
- use an approved child care service
- responsible for paying the child care fees
- meet residency and immunisation requirements.

Three things determine a family's level of Child Care Subsidy:

- A family's annual adjusted taxable income determines the percentage of subsidy they are eligible for
- An activity test determines how many hours of subsidised care families canaccess, up to a maximum of 100 per fortnight, and
- The type of child care service determines the hourly rate cap.

Transition to Covenant Christian School

Children enrolled at Covenant's Early Learning Centre have priority placement for moving on to Kindergarten at Covenant Christian School. Parents are not required to go through the application or interview process again if they wish to confirm ongoing enrolment into the Primary school when their child finishes the preschool year.

Covenant seeks to prepare preschool students for transition to their Primary education by including them in some broader school activities throughout the year. Preschool students visit the Library, have Music lessons on the main school campus and join the Kindergarten classroom for some combined activities. The Kindergarten students also visit the Early Learning Centre from time to time.

Preschool students also visit the Primary school for class assemblies, participating in the audience and learning how the older students perform at these events.

Over the past two years, our previous preschool students have smoothly transitioned to Kindergarten, already feeling comfortable and confident in their environment as they move onto this next phase in their education.
