Christian Education

We have a vision for true Christian Education. The vision of Covenant has always been to partner with parents/guardians to provide a strong spiritual and moral foundation for their children - a foundation from which we seek to develop not just academic achievement, but the building of character in its wholeness - spiritually, mentally and physically.

Covenant seeks to have a soundly biblical foundation, that students may learn that God is intimately involved in every aspect of life. Our greatest desire is that God will be recognised and honoured in all that we do.

Yes, we strive for academic excellence.

With an emphasis on direct instruction and caring (but firm) discipline, we strive for a quiet, calm classroom environment in which students can become thoroughly engrossed in their learning and be excited about the progress they are making. Our intensive phonics program for reading and writing (LEM Phonics) gives a solid foundation for all students, especially those who may encounter learning difficulties. We believe that an emphasis on literacy and numeracy in the formative years gives children the best possible grounding for future opportunities.

Yes, we are a smaller school.

Designed as a smaller school community, we are better able to offer a protective and nurturing environment. Our close-knit community enables staff to know all students by name and be concerned with their individual welfare. We also notice when they are struggling and need extra support. Your child will not get lost in the system.

Cultural Literacy

As well as being our guide for life and salvation, the Bible is an important part of **Cultural Literacy**. Familiarity with the Bible is imperative to understanding so many aspects of our Western civilisation in literature, the arts and history.

A Holistic Approach

Covenant seeks to partner with parents/guardians to develop the whole character of a child - this holistic approach looks at their mental, physical and spiritual welfare, as well as their academic achievement.

We strive to maintain a "culture of grace" for our students, which shepherds and directs children as they learn to become more self-managed and self-disciplined in their behaviour as they mature.

Direct Instruction

What is the Direct Instruction method?

Teachers at Covenant use the more traditional Direct Instruction model (teacher-centred). This means students are clearly directed and instructed in knowledge, rather than being expected to direct their own learning (child-centred).

The real power of direct instruction comes from the careful analysis of each skill taught. The skill is broken down into its component parts, then each component skill is taught to mastery. Afterward, the skills are combined into a larger context where different skills are utilised across settings, resulting in generalised fluency.








The teacher tells the students what they need to know, and shows them how to do a new skill.

Mathematics

Covenant emphasises the development of basic skills in mathematics. That includes the memorisation of basic mathematics facts including addition and subtraction facts and multiplication tables. We use both Cambridge and Signpost Mathematics texts in the Primary years and the Cambridge Essential


We believe that the Creator embedded mathematical structures into the very fabric of the whole universe. We, as His image bearers, are called to glorify Him through discovering and using mathematics as a tool in our calling to subdue and rule over this creation for our good (Gen 1:28). We do so as stewards aiming for sustainable use of all that He has given us.

Citeracy

Mathematics series is used in Years 7-10.

Covenant uses **LEM Phonics**, an Australian, intensive phonics literacy program. This program aims to teach all students to spell, write and read. The success of LEM Phonics with diverse students, including those who have learning disabilities or are learning English as an additional language, is in large part due to the integration of scientifically-based content and methodology.

Students first learn to read and write the phonograms representing the 26 letter of the alphabet (the Single Phonograms). They then proceed to master the multiple letter phonograms.



How does LEM Phonics work?

The program begins by teaching students to recognise the written symbols for the 42 sounds which make up the English language, rather than teaching the names of the letters of the alphabet. The letter symbols representing these sounds are called phonograms. Phonograms may consist of a single letter or a group of letters.

This enables students, within their first year of education, to master the foundational building blocks of the English language.

Students are then able to pronounce almost every word they encounter when reading, and are also able to spell and write words they hear.

LEM Phonics integrates five disciplines: listening, speaking, reading, writing and spelling. Students see, hear, say and write, using all channels to the brain to enhance retention.

Secondary Education



Structure & Governance

Q. Is Covenant run by one particular church?

A. No, Covenant is incorporated under the ACT Associations Incorporation Act and is seperate from any particular church. The Association's membership includes a fellowship of Christian people who are actively involved in their local Protestant church and are united in their commitment to education at Covenant.

Q. Who manages the school?

A. The general affairs of the Association are governed and managed by a governance body, known as the Council. The Council is responsible for high-level decision making, strategic planning and policy development and consists of up to nine members, all of who are members of the Association.

The School Executive manages the day-to-day operations of the school and is accountable to the Council. The School Executive includes the school's Principal and Business Manager.

The professional teaching staff under the leadership of the Principal are responsible for the day-to-day education at Covenant.

Enrolment

Please submit an Application for Enrolment form for each child electronically. Application submission fee:

A number of criteria are taken into consideration before an interview takes place and a position is offered. One full term's notice of withdrawal must be given in writing or a term's fee are payable in lieu of notice.
